



Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Survey Questions - Mathematical Thinkers Like Me

Description

This resource is provided as an example of the Inclusive Research Key Action of “ Implement frequent opportunities to pause and reflect on equity practices in research.” The questions below were used by the Mathematical Thinkers Like Me team to pause and reflect on their stated equity practices. All responses were anonymous and were summarized in narrative form for the team to reflect on together. These questions can be used as a tool to help new teams pause and reflect on their own equity practices.

Survey Questions

1. What are your thoughts about how the project is providing you with accessible and equitable opportunities? How about for others (e.g., the project team, administrators, coaches, teachers, students)?
2. What are your thoughts about the need to provide different or more opportunities to improve cultural competence?
3. What are your thoughts about the way in which (or the extent to which) the project provides an inviting, safe, and supportive environment for people from diverse backgrounds and perspectives?
4. What are your thoughts about how the project is doing in terms of including activities, methods, and objectives that are responsive to your goals and needs?
5. What else might the project attend to in order to ensure that it is inclusive, and effectively supports diversity, equity, and inclusion? Please provide concrete examples where possible.
6. Please share any thoughts you have about the ways in which the project responds to, and could respond to, the needs of equity and inclusion for students.
